ZONE 1. On Board AK ARNG AGR Only (**Must have held current position for minimum of 18 months**)

ZONE 2. All Alaska Army National Guard Members

ZONE 3. All Alaska Army and Air National Guard Members

ZONE 4. NATIONWIDE (All Military Members Eligible for Membership in the AK ARNG)

***** First consideration will be given for qualified Zone 1 – 74D's, all others will fall under ZONES 2-4**

Applicants must meet Chapter 3 physical standards IAW NGR 40-501 and AR 40-501. Soldiers must meet initial eligibility requirements of AR 135-18, Table 2-1

DUTIES: Functional responsibilities include but are not limited to: Serves as the Civil Support Team (CST) Survey Team Member. Participates in state of the art detection and sample collection training per the Survey Team training schedule. Expected to be proficient in NBC antidote administration, safe patient extraction, and crime scene/evidence preservation techniques. Participates in/monitors chain of custody (sample transfer) procedures. Follows Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) Guidelines when responding to incidents. . Performs all operational tasks while wearing appropriate level of Personnel Protective Equipment (PPE). Utilizes appropriate respiratory protection for hazard. Cross and mark contaminated areas. Utilize the established checklist and in reporting the detection, identification and sample collection actions in the Hot Zone/contaminated area. Actively participate in the Unit (mission) briefs before entering an incident site including the review of all known information on hazard, wind direction and speed, safety precautions, types of tests to be accomplished, and mission GO or NO-GO criteria. Observes and reports information on the physical layout of the incident site. Employs hand held CBRNE detection and identification equipment to confirm the presence of hazards. Processes through decontamination sites. Obtains samples for scientific analysis. Attends domestic terrorism threat briefings. Responsible to perform the duties of NBC Survey Team Chief in the event the NBC Survey Team Chief is not available during a WMD incident.

SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT CRITERIA: Subject to extended work hours, frequent deployments, and continuous training in the areas of HAZMAT and WMD CBRNE Response. Member will be on one hour recall status indefinitely with limited time allowed for leave. Required to maintain high physical fitness standards and conditioning and be required to use Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA). Must be capable of being deployed by air, sea, or land transportation to remote locations. Member will be required to undergo vaccinations such as Anthrax and Smallpox. Member must undergo physical and psychological screening by unit medical staff and pass an OSHA physical and Pulmonary Function test within 30 days of hire. Member must possess normal color vision. Member must be capable of performing strenuous physical activity for 30 minutes while wearing 40 pounds of Personal Protective Equipment. Member must have a PULHES Category of 122221 or better per DA PAM 611-21. Member with ANY chronic condition will need to be evaluated by the medical staff prior to completing the hiring process. Initial (3 year) AGR Tour of length, subject to program continuance. Member who successfully completes the initial AGR Tour will be afforded priority for extension. Entitled to CST Special Pay upon completion of MOSQ and required CST training. Member must be qualified to receive a Government Credit Card (GOVCC) for travel. **Must have or eligible to receive SECRET security level clearance with in 6 months of hiring date.**

Minimum Eligibility Criteria: Must be or be eligible to become a member of the Alaska Army National Guard. Must be able to serve at least 5 years in an active military status prior to completing 18 years of active Federal Service, on the date of mandatory removal. Must be able to complete at least 10 years of continuous service in an AGR status prior to Mandatory Removal Date. Must meet medical standards prescribed by AR 40-50. Must not be a candidate for an elective office, hold a civil office, or are engaged in partisan political activities. Must not be under a current suspension of favorable personnel actions. Applicants who voluntarily separate from the AGR program for one or more days are not eligible to reenter the program for one year from date of separation without an NGB waiver. Applicants must not be entitled to receive Federal military retired or retainer pay or Federal civil service annuities and not be eligible for immediate Federal civil service annuities. Individuals who voluntarily resign from the AGR program in lieu of mandatory or involuntary separation action are not eligible to reenter the program. Individuals who have been separated from other military services for cause, unsuitability, or unfitness for military service are not eligible to enter the AGR program. Must have or be able to obtain a current Alaska Drivers License.

Applicants must type or print in legible dark ink and SIGN AND DATE each application. Packets received without a signed and dated NGB Form 34-1 will result in non-consideration and the application will not be forwarded to the selecting supervisor. Applicants may include copies of their Certificates of Training that may be applicable to the position you are applying for but **MUST INCLUDE ALL OF THE BELOW LISTED DOCUMENTS.** If the required documents/forms are not submitted with the application package, a letter of explanation must be provided. **Incomplete application packages received will not be forwarded or considered.**

8. DA Form 5500-R/5501-R (If Applicable)
9. Copy of **all** DD Form 214 and current AGR/Mobility/ADSW orders if applicable
10. Copy of current Driver's License (Must Be Valid)
11. Security Verification from Personnel Security Manager
12. Copies of last 3 NCOERS (For E5's)

INSTRUCTIONS TO COMMANDERS/SUPERVISORS: This position vacancy announcement will be given the broadest possible dissemination. A copy of this announcement will be posted on your unit/activity bulletin board. Selecting supervisor will contact qualified applicants for interviews. After the Human Resources Officer (HRO) approves the selection package, the HRO office will send a notification letter to all

applicants of their selection/non-selection. The selection of an applicant is not final until the individual has been notified by the HRO-AGR. After the selecting supervisor makes a selection, the “routing” of the selection package begins and ends with HRO.
